



Dear Editor

Dear Henham residents,

I wanted to take a moment to say how very grateful I am to be living in such a beautiful, kind and generous community. I have long known that Henham is a very special place, but the rubber stamp has recently been sealed.

Most who know me, will know by now that I have been diagnosed with Stage 3 ovarian cancer and am currently undergoing chemotherapy. My cancer journey has been one of intense loneliness and fear, but I now have a treatment plan and I will fight this with all I have.

From the moment of diagnosis, as 'Henham's Jungle Drums' reverberated, I have been overwhelmed by the thoughtfulness and love of friends but, additionally, by the kindness of near strangers.

Generosity of time and spirit is a wondrous thing and I write this purely to say, 'never underestimate the power of your word and thought'. The feelings of love and support that the food parcels, flowers and words have given me, have kept me buoyant through some very dark days. I suppose the main thing I want to say is, I now know that, if this thing beats me, I am loved and cared for and maybe that, in the living of life, 'I did good!'.

Ethymia wrote a piece in last month's Dragon about **fundraising for Cancer Research** and this is not a plea for money. Instead, this is to let you know that Ethymia, on Sunday 2nd July, will be running the Henham 10km 4 times to replicate a (near) marathon. She will be much more likely to get through if there is a familiar (or unfamiliar) face along the way offering a word of support. She intends to start early so that her third/ fourth lap will coincide with 'the masses' so please do give her a shout. For those of you who don't know us, we'll ensure that her clothing allows her to be recognised. I will not know if I can be there until closer to the time as it will depend on my treatment cycle but, if I am absent, it will help me to know that the Henham family 'has her back'.



The Hundred Parishes area has been home to many creative people. The People section of www.hundredparishes.org.uk includes introductions to several artists, composers - and authors.



Eastern Glebe, Little Easton

Probably our best-known author was HG Wells (1866-1946) who lived for 18 years in Little Easton at 18th-century Easton Glebe. He was a prolific writer, best remembered for his science-fiction novel "War of the Worlds" which was written before he came to Little Easton. A later novel, "Mr Britling Sees it Through" was set in Little Easton.


"The Hundred and One Dalmatians" was written by Dodie Smith (1896-1990). From 1934, she lived in Finchingfield at The Barretts, 16th-century thatched house in the tiny hamlet of Howe Street. Her children's novel, written in 1956, was made into a highly successful Disney animated film. An earlier novel "I captured the Castle", written in 1948, was adapted into a film in 2003. Smith's former home is marked by a blue plaque.

Another blue plaque, on 17th-century Rose Cottage in Stebbing, identifies the former home of Henry de Vere Stacpoole (1863 - 1951) who was also a prolific author. He lived there for about 10 years in the early 1900s and during that time completed his best-known novel, "The Blue Lagoon". It has been made into a feature film several times.

Horham Hall in the parish of Thaxted was the home of novelist Evelyn Anthony (1926 – 2018) from 1968 to 1976 and then from 1982 until her death. Sixteenth century Horham Hall is Grade I-listed, and the cost of upkeep forced Evelyn and her husband to sell it, but they were able to re-purchase it when her royalties increased. Of her many novels, "The Tamarind Seed" was the best known. It was published in 1971 and made into a film in 1974, starring Julie Andrews and Omar Sharif.



From the Church, Reverend Louis Wilson writes



In 1859, the Great Blondin became the first man in history to cross the Niagara Falls between America and Canada on a tightrope. 25,000 people paid to watch him walk across this tiny rope 160 feet above the chasm of raging waters. There was no safety net, no harness, nothing but a balancing pole. If he slipped, he died.

Before he set off, he said to the crowd: Do you believe that I can get across this tightrope to the other side completely alone and unaided? *We believe Blondin, we believe*, cried the crowd. And he did it.

Over the following days and months, he crossed the Falls 300 times and in various ways. On one occasion, he walked across with a stove and a chair, and halfway across, sat down and cooked and ate an omelet! Another time, he pushed a wheelbarrow all the way across loaded with 350 pounds of cement.

The crowd were amazed and delighted until one day Blondin unloaded the wheelbarrow and shouted down to them: Do you believe that I could push this wheelbarrow all the way across the rope, and all the way back, with a man sitting in it?

As one, the crowd shouted: We believe Blondin, we believe! To which Blondin asked, well, who's going to get in then? At this point, there was deafening silence - not one person was willing.

The Bible says there is a Niagara like chasm between us and God. We can't jump over it, we can't ignore it, we can't go round it, and we can't climb down it. It's a chasm that stops us spending eternity with God.

The Bible says it's caused by our sin, by our rebellion against the loving, holy, perfect God who made us. There's just no way for us to get across. What we need is someone to bridge the gap for us.

In John 10:11, Jesus says: I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

Jesus is claiming that by his sacrificial death on a cross 2000 years ago, he has bridged the gap. All we must do is trust him. All we must do is get into the wheelbarrow.

But for lots of us, that is quite an issue! The crowds were fascinated by Blondin, and it's possible for us to be very familiar with Jesus and the Gospel, to examine his claims, even admire his teaching, but never actually trust him with our lives. I think it was entirely reasonable not to accept Blondin's invitation! The chasm at Niagara was terrifying – and I have no need to cross it. But Jesus doesn't ask us to get across the eternal chasm in our own strength, or by our own effort. He's offering to take us. He's offering us his wheelbarrow. All we need to do is get in.

Plans for New ultrafast broadband in Henham

Henham Parish Council had a meeting with Gigaclear on 10th May. Gigaclear have announced their intention to bring ultra fast broadband into the village in late 2023, early 2024 and make it available to most residents from early 2024. The Gigaclear presentation covered the following main points

- ➤ Gigaclear will offer speeds of up to 900 Mps, same speed for upload and download.
- Two methods of delivery to homes, use the Openreach existing infrastructure, poles or ducts. Gigaclear would bring their fibre to the bottom of a pole, run it to the top and bring it to the home similar to the present telephone line. Alternatively new ducting to the house may be required.
- ➤ Delivery through the village will be by narrow trenching across greens or verges.
- Residents will be able to transfer their home phone to a Voice over Internet phone for an additional £3 a month. They can use their existing phone and keep their existing number.
- ➤ Gigaclear opening offers will offer 300 Mps for £17 a month. The first customers to sign up will be offered 500 Mps for £20 a month.
- ➤ Every eligible resident will receive a letter from Gigaclear in the summer. There are a few areas that will be outside the Gigaclear area, these seem, in the main, to be the area around the Church.
- ➤ Gigaclear will undertake presentations in the autumn in Village Hall.
- ➤ The Parish Council will have a single point of contact during installation to deal with any issues of concern.

Residents who have existing poles on their property, or own land which Gigaclear needs to access, will have already received a communication to seek permission to install their equipment.

The Parish Council welcomes this new initiative to improve internet capabilities in the village. It will present challenges during the installation process, but the PC hopes to manage these to a minimum. The purpose of this article is both to inform residents of the initiative, and to alert those under contract with other Internet Providers that this new service will become available in or about January 2024.



The role involves checking for new referrals on your working day, ringing the clients to arrange a delivery time, check on their needs, likes and dislikes.

The delivery area is quite small, Stansted, Elsenham, Henham, half of Takeley and the Hallingbury's

June is a lovely month at the Gardens, and there is an ever-changing cast list of flowers to look forward to. If you don't have internet access, or need a little extra help, call our friendly advisers on 01799 618840 and they will carry out a benefit check for you.

Are you off-grid? Homes not connected to the gas grid may be eligible for a £200 Alternative Fuels Payment. If you have an electricity supplier, check your bank or energy account to see if you received the payment in February. If you're on a prepayment meter, vouchers should have been sent by text, email or post. If you don't have an electricity supplier or have not received the payment, you can apply now.

But don't delay! Applications close 31st May.

In the Garden

Hello again Dear Reader. *Tempus Fugit* and all that. Halfway through another year and plenty to do in the garden. I have looked back at previous articles and find it interesting to compare the weather patterns year on year (I know, I should get out more). It is quite amazing how the years differ, but the underlying factor remains the signs of global warming.

Late May, early June is probably the best time to prune shrubs which have flowered, such as Forsythia, Ribes and Spirea "Bridal Wreath". Cut back all the shoots which have flowered, taking care not to cut into old wood. Next year's flowers will be formed on the new wood which will result from the pruning. If you have Escallonia hedging or specimen shrubs, trimming them now will encourage flowering in summer. If you have a Laburnum tree or trees in your garden, pick off any low growing pods and sweep up any fallen ones, as they are extremely poisonous, and children seem to find them fascinating. A shrub that is often neglected and left to its own devices is Photinia (Red Robin), with its wonderful deep red foliage. Once the foliage has turned green, give it a trim and you should soon get another flush (excuse the pun) of bright red leaves.

It goes without saying that the weeding should be maintained and the grass should be cut. The blades should now be set to your preferred height of cut and if you haven't yet done so, it is still a good time to apply a general all-purpose lawn treatment. Remember not to cut the grass for three days prior to – and after applying.

Time once again for my "Tip of the Month". This month's tip is for those of you who have ponds. We all know how unsightly pond weed is and how difficult it is to remove. You can spend hours trying to scoop it out. Well, here is a quick, cheap and easy way to deal with it. Buy a cheap, round hairbrush and tie it to a long pole or bamboo cane. Push the brush into the weed and twist it round and round. The weed wraps itself neatly around the brush, allowing you to remove it quickly and easily. Even if there isn't any weed visible on the surface, a weekly rolling of the brush just below the surface of the pond can prevent the start of any pond weed problems, Always be careful not to harm any of the fish or pond plants and it is a good idea to place the weed you remove at the side of the pond and leave it there for a few days, so that any pond creatures you remove can crawl back into the water,

Some houseplants will benefit from a spell outdoors in summer and the end of June is a good time to put them out. Plants in pots dry out very quickly, so be prepared to water daily if necessary. As we are on the subject of houseplants, how do you fancy trying something which may be new to you?

You can easily increase your stock of houseplants by taking leaf cuttings. It is not nearly as difficult as you might think. Let's start with the easiest method. Suitable donor plants include Begonias, Peperomias and gloxinias, but most fleshy leaved plants can be used. Cut a healthy, newly matured leaf, with its stalk attached, from the plant. Bury the stalk in a pot filled with either a mixture of peat and sand or cutting compost with a little grit added. If you are using a plastic pot, place the cutting as close to the side of the pot as you can. For some reason, unknown to me, cuttings seem to be more successful if planted this way. This also means that you can plant several leaves around the rim of the plot. Plants such as Mother-in-Law's Tongue and Cape Primrose have long leaves which can be cut into 2 inch (5 cm) sections and planted vertically in the direction in which they grow, i.e. with the veins pointing upwards. Leaf cuttings are vulnerable to both rotting and drying out, so a delicate balancing act is required. Bottom heat will speed up the rooting process, so if you have an electric propagator, that will provide the perfect environment. Once the young plants appear they can be potted up, using a good quality multi-purpose compost.

Another job for June is pruning Clematis. Many gardeners break out in a cold sweat when pruning Clematis is mentioned, but as long as you follow these very simple rules, it really isn't difficult. There are basically two types of Clematis, early or late flowering and the type is the key as to when to prune. Early flowering Clematis are pruned when the flowers have died, which is about now. Later flowering Clematis are pruned in early spring. Cut out all the old and weak growth and reduce the remainder by about half. This will give the plant the whole summer to form new shoots, which will give masses of flower next year.

Many plants can be made to become bushier by pinching out the top pair of leaves while they are still quite small, helping to fill the space with fewer plants. Continue to support taller plants as they grow to prevent them falling over and spoiling your displays.

If you are growing vegetables, remember to keep weeds down by hoeing between the rows. Do this on dry days, as hoeing when the soil is wet will cause the weeds to spread rather than die off. You can now plant out outdoor tomatoes and cucumbers, remembering to provide support for them.

Well, Dear Reader, I feel it is time for me to go and lie down in a darkened room, so I will bid you farewell until next time and, as usual, wish you "Happy Gardening".


