

The Hundred Parishes Society

Residents living in the countryside of the Hundred Parishes are fortunate that the intrusive sounds of human activities are less when compared to those living within built up areas close to main roads or railway tracks or beneath regular flight paths. Even within our homes our ears are subjected to a cacophony of sounds: TV or radio programmes, ring tones, the hum of machines, barking dogs or noisy neighbours. Rarely are we surrounded by silence!

Appreciating tranquillity is an essential aspect of being in the countryside, where it should be possible to scan attractive views of verdant landscapes or cloudy skyscapes, hear natural sounds and catch glimpses of wildlife without intrusive background noises. Evidence gathered over the past 15 years reveals that tranquillity is not just a pleasurable experience but is essential for human health and wellbeing reducing stress levels and lifting spirits.

In the early 1990's concerns were raised about the harmful levels of intrusive noise in daily lives. The Countryside Commission and the Council for the Protection of Rural England worked together to produce an Intrusion Map which highlighted areas that were most affected by human-induced noises. Since then, research has been undertaken by CPRE and others to develop suitable methodology for measuring noise and evaluate the visual impact of developments on landscapes.

In 2012, tranquillity gained recognition in national planning policy. Now studies are prepared to evaluate Landscape Character Areas and their Sensitivity to Change, and these are included in the reports prepared for Local Plans. They must include appropriate mitigation measures to help reduce intrusive noise to acceptable levels.





Rusty Rackets

I referred earlier to an epic match but how often do we witness an epic game? In one of the most enthralling games I have ever seen, in this year's Wimbledon Final, in the fifth game of the third set, Carlos Alcaraz broke Novak Djokovic's serve after 13 deuces, in a game which lasted 26 minutes! The entire first set was only eight minutes longer than that. It was the longest game in a men's Wimbledon final by points played – 32. Remarkably, it lasted longer than the entire 1922 women's final between Suzanne Lenglen and Molla Mallory, the former winning 6-2, 6-0 in just 23 minutes! So, to end this month here is a classic blunder caused by the pressure of another kind, live broadcasting, by one of the most articulate of all commentator's, Murray Walker: "And now excuse me while I interrupt myself."

Let's hope that the weather doesn't interrupt our tennis for a few weeks.



In the Garden

Hello again Dear Reader. Here we are in September, coming towards the end of what has been a pretty wet and miserable summer. Let us try to look on the bright side (if there is one), at least we haven't had to water quite so often! We can also appreciate those beautiful autumn colours, as the trees turn from green to russet, yellow and bronze and the late flowering plants continue to provide vibrant splashes of colour. Chrysanthemums, Dahlias, Sedum and Asters (Michaelmas Daisies), come into their own, bringing colour into the beds. Others, such as Alliums, Nectarascordum, Phlomis and many of the ornamental grasses still provide interest, even after their blooms have faded.

Deadheading is as important as ever if you wish to prolong the flowering season, as is weeding. Plants which have finished flowering can be cut down now and if you have been growing plants in pots, these can be placed in the borders to fill any gaps.


September is when I start planning my next year's borders. No matter how much you try, there are always plants which you wish you had planted in different places. Now is the time to think about moving them if you can. The advantage of moving them now is twofold. Firstly, you can get a good idea of how they will look in their new space and secondly, moving them now will give them all of the autumn to establish their root system.

It is time to complete the purchase of spring bulbs and, if possible, get them into the ground or pots. Multi planting in pots is a great idea, as it really gives a wonderful display which lasts for quite a long time. It works particularly well with large pots. Part fill your pot with compost, then plant a layer of dwarf tulips. You can place them quite close together. Put in another layer of compost until you can just see the tips of the tulip bulbs, then plant a layer of mini daffodils (Tete a Tete or Rip Van Winkle are good choices) between the tulips. Put in more compost, then plant a layer of dwarf Dutch Iris bulbs. Top up with compost and finish off with winter Pansies, Bellis, Polyanthus, or Violas and trailing ivy. These are the plants I use, but you can use plants of your own choice instead if you wish. Nowadays there are many different types of trailing Pansies and Violas, which look great in large pots and in winter hanging baskets.

Climbing and rambling roses are best pruned now, by removing old, damaged and unwanted growth that has finished flowering. Retain any new shoots, particularly

those which have sprouted from ground level, as these will bear the majority of next year's flowers. Always use a pruning cut when cutting back roses, to encourage fresh shoots.

If your hedges are looking a little untidy, give them a final trim, as this will mean you can leave the spring cutting until the birds have finished nesting. If you have a quiet corner in your garden, you could build a small pile of branches and twigs in the hope of encouraging hedgehogs into the garden. These lovely little animals are voracious eaters of slugs, the gardener's worst enemy. They are also in decline, so encouraging them in can help to preserve the species.

In dry, hot weather (if we see any), Rhododendrons and Camellias need regular watering to help swell the buds for next year's flowers. It's also a good idea to give them an occasional feed of either liquid seaweed, or Sulphate of Iron (Ferrous Sulphate).

It is still a good time to take softwood cuttings of Fuchsias, Chrysanthemums and Pelargonium cuttings etc. The latter are probably the easiest plants to propagate from cuttings which can be taken from almost anywhere on the plant, no rooting powder is needed, just poke them into a pot of compost and leave them in a warm, light place. Job done. If you like collecting seed from your plants for future sowing, now is the time to do it. Make sure the seed pods are really ripe when you collect them, then dry them out thoroughly. I put them in paper cups and leave them on a windowsill. When they are completely dry, store them in clearly labelled paper packets or envelopes, never in jars or plastic containers, as they will go mouldy. The exception to this rule is Agapanthus. Agapanthus seeds should be collected when ripe, then sown immediately into pots of compost.

Lawns still need some attention other than the normal cutting. If you have fruit trees, be sure to collect up windfalls regularly, so that they don't rot on the grass. Apply an autumn lawn fertilizer after raking thoroughly to remove moss and dead grass. Carry on mowing regularly. I have found that a good way of deterring the birds from eating fruit on the tree is to hang old CDs on strings from the branches. The slightest breeze makes the CDs spin and frighten off the birds.

Well Dear Reader, that's about it for this month. Another epic completed, so all that remains is for me to say goodbye until next month and wish you, "Happy Gardening."





From the Church

The Reverend Louis Wilson writes...

At 6 pm on Sunday 10 September 2023, Rob Munro, the Bishop of Ebbsfleet will be holding a confirmation service for us at Henham Church. It will in fact be the last service in the church building for some time, as the long-awaited refurbishment work will begin the next day. I do hope that as many as possible will feel able to be there to enjoy the occasion and support our candidates.

In preparation for that service, we've been looking at what the Lord Jesus says a Christian is using a very simple jigsaw puzzle. It only has five pieces (all beginning with B): *believing, belonging, behaving, baptism and born again* - but the challenge is not to put the pieces together, it's to make sure that we're holding all five.

For example, many of us were baptised as children. But if you stop there, you're not getting the full picture of what Jesus says a Christian is.

You can be baptised and have beliefs, but you've got to have all five pieces to be what Jesus would call a real, authentic Christian – with all the benefits that go with that. Unfortunately, many people's experiences of the Christian life stop disappointingly short because they just haven't grasped the benefits.

A few years ago, my family and I stayed in a beautiful cottage on the Kent Sussex border. It was a wonderful place to stay, but to enjoy it fully you needed to know about the benefits. Five minutes' walk from the cottage, was the Oasts Christian Centre and if you were staying at the cottage, you had unlimited access to the Oasts' indoor heated swimming pool and the tennis court.

Imagine coming home from the cottage without enjoying those benefits because you didn't know about them. It's like that with every part of the Christian life. If we don't listen to what Jesus says, we'll miss out on many of the benefits.

There's no particular order for these five jigsaw pieces – they're all important – what matters is holding all of them.

When it comes to *believing*, we need to know who Jesus is – not just a good man but God himself come to earth personally. We need to know why Jesus came: not just to show us God but to rescue us from the judgment our sin deserves. His death pays the penalty for our sin so that we can be forgiven and our relationship with God repaired.

Finally, we need to know what Jesus commands: repent and believe. On the cross, Jesus has done everything necessary for us to be reconciled to God. Everything. But we must respond with repentance otherwise that relationship remains broken. Repentance is simply believing something enough to do it: to climb off the fence and trust this man with my life.

I do hope that you can join us on 10 September. After that, there will be no morning service in Henham until the building work is finished, but our Sunday evening service (with the usual groups) will continue every week at 6 pm in OSCA.

Meninadança 2023 7th October (7pm, Henham Village Hall)

You are invited to a charity event at Henham Village Hall with drinks, food and a special dance performance by a group of girls from our projects in Brazil.

Meninadança is a local charity which fights child sexual exploitation and trafficking in Brazil. We work with over 400 girls aged 11-17 every day at five 'Pink Houses' in remote towns along the BR-116, Brazil's longest motorway which is known as the 'exploitation highway' because of the high incidence of child prostitution. Using dance, beauty therapy, art and other activities, in a safe environment and a space just for them, we reach and empower girls who have had their childhoods and futures stolen by the highway.

We also have a team of lawyers who bring abusers and exploiters to justice, and psychologists who help the girls come to terms with their past and face the future without fear. You can find more about our work at meninadanca.org.

In October 2023 we are bringing over a group of girls from our Pink Houses, who will be taking a two-week dance extravaganza around the UK.

Three girls, Moany, 13, Rany, 14 and Maluiza, 14, will be performing a moving dance interpretation of the work of famous Brazilian poet Cora Coralina. Using Brazilian songs and traditional dance and costumes, 'Stones & Flowers' describes taking the stones meant to crush us to build something beautiful and plant flowers - just what many of the girls we work with have done.

They will also be accompanied by Keyla, the coordinator of one of our Pink Houses, who will be talking about her work on the frontline of the child sexual exploitation epidemic in Brazil, something which for years has remained hidden and unreported.

The event will include a delicious Brazilian meal cooked and served by London-based restaurant Rogerio's Brazilian Kitchen.

Please join us for what will be an unforgettable evening, as well as a chance to get together with others from our community and help make a difference in the lives of vulnerable girls who desperately need to know they are loved and valued.

District Councillors' Report

Though the Summer should be slightly less busy, we continue to keep working during the summer and as we write this, we have planned three Emergency Meetings for the end of August.

Following our last Full Council, the Chief Executive has written to the government, calling for urgent action to require all HGV drivers to use specific Sat Navs that guide them away from unsuitable roads and bridges in the district and onto more appropriate routes. Please email us if you have any difficulties with Lorries as data collection always helps.

A letter to the Secretary of State for Transport on the proposed railway ticket office closures, has been sent, with a similar submission made separately to the official consultation process. Elsenham Ticket Office is an asset to the villages, and a flagship for other offices. We want it to stay open.

We have run our first corporate programme for Work Experience and the students have been introduced to how the council works and have spent time in Planning & Building Control, Communities, Housing and Environmental Services, IT, Environmental Health, Customer Services, Economic Development and Democratic Services. Introducing young people to the work that UDC does and showing them that we are an employer of choice is part of the Workforce Plan and the steps taken to create a workforce that is diverse and skilled for the future.

We have been having meetings with North Essex Councils to address issues of savings required and the possibility of shared services. The scarcity of monies allocated to District Councils means we must explore all avenues to ensure high quality services are delivered.

Uttlesford Community Safety Partnership has funded a state-of-the-art speed gun, as part of its aim in assisting to reduce casualties on our roads. Vehicle details can be uploaded electronically, and tickets are posted straight to the offending motorists - removing the need for police officers to pull over a vehicle and issue an on-the-spot fine. As a partnership, we are always looking at finding long-term solutions to make our roads safer and the use of this camera will assist in this goal.


