#### **Henham Parish Council**

Edited minutes of meeting on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2023. Full minutes are available to view on the village website www.henham.org

- 1. Reports and Recommendations
- (i) Greens and Village Estate Cllr. Baker:
- a. Greens damage (1) Erosion Nothing to report (2) (i) Construction damage by Hollybank Cllr Lee is monitoring the situation and is in discussions with the contractor regarding a plan for the repairs over the coming weeks. (ii) Driveway New narrow strip has been installed and will be coloured matched to driveways along Crow Street, under supervision of Cllr Lee.
- **b. Greens Bylaws** Legal advice now received. Procedure for updating laws is lengthy and complicated. Chair will be reviewing over the coming months.
- c. Starr Road Signage and pot holes UDC called the Chair in July to say that a resident refused them permission to install the new Starr Road sign. The Chair confirmed to UDC that this must be installed and the resident had no right to refuse permission as it is not being installed on their land, even though their replacement hedging and logs have been planted in front of the old sign, evidence supporting this has bee sent to UDC. This is now a matter for UDC and the resident. Chair to monitor.
- **d.** Coronation commemoration Nothing to report.
- e. Tree Inspection The Chair instructed our arborist to conduct our 2 yearly tree inspection which was carried w/c 21 August quotation for £1065. The mowing sub-contractor while strimming accidentally damaged the trunk of the Jubilee Tree and has provided a tree protection slip to prevent any further damage when strimming. Our arborist noted evidence of strimmer damage on other trees, our mower contractor has been advised and will ensure his sub contactors do not strim around the trees going forwards. The Parish Council are awaiting the arborist report, however, some trees at the back of the pond need pollarding, it is hoped works can be combined with removing the fallen tree in the pond.
- **f. Church works** The Parish Council has been advised that the main groundworks are to commence w/c 14<sup>th</sup> August with the church being handed over to the contractors on 11<sup>th</sup> September with an expectation that the church will be back in use August /September 2024. PCC are anticipating a site meeting in August/early September 2023 and Cllr Lee will be invited along to meet the contractor. The contractor will not be siting buildings etc on the green before they start on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2023.
- **g.** Footpath hedge trimming There is some overgrown hedging along village footpaths/pavements. Cllr Leech to provide Chair with locations so that the

Chair can ask residents to trim back their hedging now that the nesting season is over.

**h. Old Mead Road signposts** – The Parish Council would like to thank the resident for refurbishing the two old signposts at the Hall Road junction in Old Mead Road, the resulting work is fantastic and we are extremely grateful for his community spirit.

**Village ponds/Woodland** – Nothing to report.

Village Hall – (1) Solicitors - have been instructed to review the ownership and responsibility for the Village Hall as the existing documentation is 100 years old and needs updating. Legal advice still awaited. (2) HPC Community Support Fund – successful application by Dinky Dragons Playgroup which Cllrs have approved. Enquiries have been made by the Christmas Fayre committee. (3) Village Hall grant - Cllrs agreed nem con that the Clerk can issue the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the Parish Council Village Hall grant which is £2,500.

**PCSO** – The PCSO will be available to discuss any resident concerns in the Village Shop between 10am-1am on the following dates: August 7th and 17th, September 4th and 13th, October 18th, November 6th and 20th and December 11th 2023. Everyone welcome.

**Speedwatch** – Nothing to report.

**Management of Pledgdon Green** - (a) Solicitors have now been instructed and have quoted £500-750 plus VAT, legal advice still awaited (b) A resident has emailed the Parish Council about a property running an airport parking business at Pledgdon Green.

Website – The clerk has finished populating the new website, which involves uploading all documents and formatting the template. Website went live 29/08/2023 https://henham-pc.gov.uk. The Parish Councils would encourage residents to provide the clerk with any additional information they would like to see on the new website e.g. details of clubs/societies, photos etc. Please note the old website will still be available but will no longer be updated as of August 2023. Clerk circulated information to all Cllrs re email storage and recommended that Cllrs have a gov.uk email address to do HPC work. Cllr Lee proposed to adopt the Flexmail system provided by the website company at a slightly higher annual cost which allows 10GB storage for up to 10 Cllrs, seconded by Cllr LeCount. The clerk has a new email address: clerk@henham-pc.gov.uk. This means that the Parish Council is now compliant with our Audit regulations for 23/24.

**Gigaclear** – Nothing to report other than Cllr Franklin continues to chase Gigaclear to repair the damaged box on OML which residents have repaired at their own expense and are seeking recompense from Gigaclear (Complaint Case Number: 01370719).

BASICS Essex (British Association for Immediate Care Essex) – BASICS has made a request for the Parish Council to make a donation via the website. It is a network of volunteer emergency doctors and paramedics, who provide immediate access to pre-hospital 'Immediate Medical Care'. District Cllr Lees to investigate.

Bus Consultation – ECC have launched a consultation on their Supported Local Bus Services 2024-2028. They would like to obtain people's views to help us shape the bus network across the County. Please note this consultation does not include the commercial bus network. The consultation commences 14 July 2023 and closes 05 October 2023. Residents are encouraged to complete the survey online by visiting the web site https://consultations.essex.gov.uk/iptu/2023. If people are unable to complete the consultation online, a hard copy of the consultation can be sent on request via passenger.transport@essex.gov.uk or telephoning 0345 743 0430 or 0345 603 7631. Cllr Francis to submit a response on behalf of the Parish Council.

(ii) Finance – available to see on the village website www.henham.org

**Treasury Management Investment Policy and Strategy 2023/24** – Cllr Fisher-update Cllr Fisher has been researching the best interest paying accounts which comply with our investment policy over the summer recess. Cllr Fisher and the clerk have been liaising with Yorkshire Building Society in order to invest the Parish Council's cash reserves of £280k into a higher paying rate of interest at 5.44% for one year with an annual interest of £15,301.81. The deposit was made on 6/9/23. The Nationwide account ending 148 has been closed – closing balance £270,169.98 which includes £5,297.45 annual interest. The Parish Council thanks Cllr Fisher for all his hard work.

**AGAR 2022-23 for Henham PC** – The Year-End Accounts have been approved by the external auditor by the clerk. Notice of Conclusion of Audit will be published on website and noticeboard on 8 September 2023.

**2023-2024 Accounts** – Q1 Accounts for 23/24 have been submitted by the clerk to Cllr Fisher for review and approval.

#### (iii) Planning and Developments -

- UTT/23/0713/OP Outline Planning Application, With All Matters Reserved Except Scale & Access, for the erection of up to 7 dwellings and associated work, Land West Of Old Mead Road. The Parish Council objected to a previous application and have submitted an objection. This has been called in by District Cllr Lees.
- UTT/23/1724/HHF proposed new front entrance porch, single storey side and rear extensions with changes to fenestration, with additional dormer and fenestration to existing annexe, York Cottage, Crow Street
- UTT/23/1741/FUL proposed Erection of an office building (Use Class E(g)(i)), parking area and associated works, Mill Pond Nursery Mill Road
- UTT/23/1732/FUL proposed change of use of paddock to residential and construction of 3 no. residential dwellings, Tudor Hall Pledgdon Green. This has been called in by District Cllr Lees. The Planning Sub Committee have submitted an objection with a further evidence submitted on 31/8/23.
- UTT/23/1799/HHF proposed Demolition of existing conservatory and erection of replacement single storey rear extension Littlebrook, Crow Street
- The Barn, Old Mead Road Cllrs Franklin and Leech have absented themselves from any discussions or involvement in this matter. (a) planning consent granted for 2 dwellings at The Barn, Old Mead Road. The conditions on the visibility splays at the exit onto Old Mead Road and conditions had to be met before ground works started on the properties. Groundworks have now started. (b) UTT/23/2092/FUL proposed dwelling and cartlodge garage on Plot 2 (alternative design to that approved under planning permission UTT/21/2328/FUL), The Barn Old Mead Road Chair will submit an objection on behalf of the Parish Council as to the addition of a new pedestrian access onto OML.
- UTT/23/1760/HHF proposed single storey rear extension, Ugley Lodge, North Hall Road
- UTT/23/1382/FUL proposed erection of a new detached 4 bedroom dwelling, Four Winds, Old Mead Lane Cllr Franklin has withdrawn from meetings regarding this application on grounds of personal interest. Planning Sub Committee obtained the advice of our transport consultant and a traffic counter survey (equipment was subsequently vandalised) which has been submitted together with the Parish Council's objection. This has been called in by District Cllr Lees.

• UTT/23/1953/HHF – proposed Erection of detached garden room, Dolls Cottage, The Row

**Breaches:** Continuing breaches at Cedar Cottage- Nothing to report.



#### **District Councillors' Report**

Our Chair of the Council Cllr Geof Driscoll has been cycling round the district this week to raise awareness and funds for local charity, Accuro. He has covered more than 70 miles visiting every ward in Uttlesford on an electric hybrid bike. He has visited Ward Initiatives such as the Littlebury Energy Project and Multi Agency housing initiative.

One School in Uttlesford has been affected by the RAAC concrete problem and we spent a day organising how they could be accommodated in London Rd. Finalising all the details we were then told that the Education Secretary had declared it was safe to stay in their building. However, we were delighted with the "can do attitude" and the desire to help. We are now assessing our council properties to ensure that we are not susceptible. At this present time the reports are positive.

We have been spending the summer addressing the change programme required for the Council to help us to continue to deliver a streamlined service, despite lack of funding from Central Office. Sadly Governmental Legal Changes has meant that our allocated monies from our investments cannot be utilised in the immediate future despite our success. Other councils such as Thurrock, for example, have lost millions, so there is blanket legal requirement, even for those like us that have invested well.

We have joined with Essex and other District Councils with a Food Waste Recycling Scheme. All residents will be receiving a four page information leaflet explaining the benefits and importance of recycling food waste. Please do read and consider implementing the recommendations .

Our Environmental Health colleagues who work on the border check point at Stansted Airport had an interesting find during a routine inspection last week. The team was alerted to a shipment of canine semen which is subject to veterinary checks and a product dealt with on a very regular basis. However, when the package arrived, it was clearly not packaged in the same way as canine semen



normally is (in most cases, it is presented in a plastic pod, suspended in liquid nitrogen; or is sometimes chilled, surrounded by freezer packs). Instead it was in a cardboard box and was clearly not chilled. The package contained two clear plastic bags of what appeared to be green pellets with a very strong odour. Suspecting this was cannabis, they contacted Border Force who confirmed their suspicions and took control of the packages, which weighed 1kg. The matter will be referred to the police for investigation.

This is just one of the many interesting elements that the team can encounter and highlights the importance they have in supporting partner agencies in border protection. The team deals with more than 1,000 shipments a year and process millions of pounds of biological and animal-based products – everything from preserved sea cucumbers to bovine retinas.



# Thought for the month by Charles Willbe

On the internet I found lists of "best known", "best liked", "most popular" parables but only the "Good Samaritan" was on all of them. I reckon it should also be on a "least understood" list.

Jesus' disciples had just visited a hostile Samaritan village, so they asked Jesus "do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?". A gross over-reaction which shows just how much the Jews and Samaritans hated each other.

The religious leaders and authorities hated Jesus and were trying to get rid of Him, so one of them tried to catch Jesus out by asking "what must I DO to inherit eternal life?" Jesus replied "What is written in the Law?" and, being a lawyer, the man could quote from scripture "Love the Lord your God … Love your neighbour as yourself." DO that and "you will live" says Jesus.

The problem is that the lawyer cannot love God with all his heart; he cannot love his neighbour as he loves himself ... so he won't live. Perhaps if he can get a nice narrow definition of "neighbour", he can fool himself that he is doing what God says he should. So, he asks "who is my neighbour" and Jesus answers him with this parable of the Good Samaritan.

A man is walking alone along a very dodgy road and is beaten up by robbers who strip him of everything of value and leave him to die. A priest, a teacher of God's word, walks past and doesn't help him. A Levite, one of the people who, like this lawyer, were support staff for the priests wouldn't help him either. And now a despised Samaritan comes along. But he takes pity on the Jew, who probably despised him; he goes to help him, uses his wine to sterilise the wounds and his oil to ease their pain, uses his own clothes for bandages. He puts the man on his donkey and he himself walks to the inn where he looks after him. Next day he pays for a few weeks board and lodging for the Jew and writes a blank cheque for further expenses.

In other words, the Samaritan cares, takes pity, risks his own life, interrupts his business, personally looks after the man and spends his own money on the man's care, underwriting the full expense.

That is what it means to love your neighbour, says Jesus. If you want to earn eternal life by what you DO then that is what is necessary. DO that not just once but every day of your life.

We know the world would be a much better place if everyone acted like that but none of us can ... any more than the man left to die by the roadside could do



anything to save his own life. His salvation was the love and care freely and abundantly given, despite its cost, by someone that he probably despised.

We cannot DO anything to "inherit eternal life". We also must receive salvation as an undeserved GIFT from God.

#### In The Garden

Well Dear Reader, here we are in October. Once again, the year is flying by and it seems as if I have only just put my keyboard away and it is already time to dust it off and start again. It has not been the greatest summer this year, but it appears to have been good growing weather for both flowers, vegetables and of course, those ever present, ever flourishing weeds.

If you are growing tomatoes, this seems to be a good year and you may (like me), have quite a lot of green fruits still on the plants. If you reduce the watering, these will ripen more quickly, but if you need the space and don't want an inexhaustible supply of tomato chutney, pick the fruits and place them in a paper lined drawer with an apple, or a banana. Keep an eye on them, as they should soon ripen. An alternative to this, if you are not in a rush to clear the greenhouse, is to hang banana skins amongst the plants.

If you grow Hellebores, now is the time to tidy them up. Remove old or spotted leaves, leaving a nice clean plant. In prolonged dry periods, keep Camellias and Rhododendrons well-watered to make sure the buds continue to develop.

After a while, clumps of herbaceous perennials begin to weaken in the centre. If left long enough a dead area will actually develop. Autumn is the best time to rectify this. Lift the clump and divide it, discarding the central portion, then replant the outer sections. This will give you a healthy and vigorous plant for the next year.

October and November are the best months for laying turf. As with most things, preparation is key. Rake the area to be turfed to a fairly fine tilth and try to remove as many stones as you possibly can. Allow the soil to settle and tread it down if necessary. Try to purchase the turves on the day you intend to lay them so they don't have a chance to dry out. Once you have laid them, keep them well watered.

Attach grease bands to apple and cherry trees to prevent winter moths from climbing them and laying their eggs. If you have harvested all the apples and pears you can prune those trees between now and February. This will improve next year's harvest. If you intend pruning cherry or plum trees, do it earlier rather than later to avoid "silver leaf" or die back.

Most Chrysanthemums can be left in the ground over winter (although I do prefer to lift mine and overwinter them in the greenhouse). If you are leaving them in the ground, don't cut the foliage down, apart from dead heading. This will help

protect them from the frost and they can then be cut down in spring. This also applies to Sedums and Euphorbias.

Leave Dahlias in the ground until the frost blackens them, then carefully lift them with a fork and clean off as much earth as you can. Cut the foliage off, leaving about 6 inches (15 cm) of the stems. Store them upside down in a greenhouse or shed for a couple of weeks to let them dry out and they can then be stored until next spring. There are many different ideas about storing Dahlia tubers and most of them work. Probably the easiest way is to simply store them in a net. Check them occasionally to make sure they haven't dried out. If they have, just put them in a bucket of warm water for an hour or so. Another good way is to store them in a tray of vermiculite or perlite, remembering to keep the crowns clear.

This is also a good time to start preparing your greenhouse (if you have one) for winter. If you use bubble wrap for insulation, check that it is still sound. Some of the cheap bubble wrap goes really flaky due to the ultraviolet rays and must be regularly replaced. Give everything (including pots and trays) a good clean. If you have painted on greenhouse shading, now is the time to remove it.

Try to keep lawns free of fallen fruit, leaves and other detritus so that moss doesn't form. Worn or damaged areas can be re-seeded or re-turfed now and a good raking with a metal-pronged lawn rake will remove dead grass and help with drainage. This is also the time to apply an autumn fertilizer. If you refer back to the August Dragon, you may recall that I wrote about trying a new way to neutralise the uric acid. I am really pleased to be able to report that this certainly seems to be succeeding. The existing brown patches seem to be greening up nicely and no more have so far appeared.

Well, Dear Reader, I think my quill's feather is starting to droop, but before I leave you, I feel a quirky tip coming on. This is yet another way of protecting special plants from attack by slugs and snails. Take a 2 litre plastic drinks bottle, cut off the top and bottom and cut the remaining tube into 3" (7.5 cm) wide rings. Place these around vulnerable plants and push them about 1 inch (2.5 cm) into the ground. The sharp edge of the plastic is usually enough to deter the slugs, but you can further enhance the deterrent by putting sharp grit or crushed eggshells into the ring.

It is time to leave you to your gardening chores. So until next month, Happy Gardening.

Thatch has been used as a roofing material for thousands of years. It was once common in rural areas because the material was cheap and readily available. Now, a thatched roof is much more expensive but the skill of the thatcher can still be seen throughout The Hundred Parishes. A thatcher undertakes a five-year apprenticeship with a master thatcher before becoming a master thatcher himself.

Most properties in the UK use either long straw, wheat reed or water reed. Many thatched properties are listed and when re-thatching is needed there is a requirement to use the same type of material as before

In medieval times wheat grew to nearly 6 feet tall, while today's modern farming methods produce shorter-stemmed wheat and this has weakened the straw and its longevity. Now specialist growers produce taller-stemmed varieties, grown especially for thatching.

There is some debate about the longevity of a thatched roof. To some extent, life expectancy relates to the material used, but it is also dependent on factors such as pitch, orientation and air circulation. A good thatch will typically last from 20 to

50 years, providing excellent insulation. The ridge, along the top of the roof, will last between 10 and 20 years, so requires more frequent attention.

Traditionally a new layer of material is laid over the seasoned roof; this is called "spar coating". The bundles of straw taken up onto the roof are called "yelms". Twisted hazel sticks known as "spars" or "gads" are used to secure the thatch in place. A thatcher may mark his work by placing a distinctive straw finial on the ridge.

Thatch appears not only on houses. There are several thatched pubs, a thatched church at Duddenhoe End in the parish of Elmdon, and a partly-thatched village hall in Ashdon.

Universal Credit is one monthly payment for people in work, looking for work, or unable to work. It brings together six older benefits and must be claimed through the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP).

**You won't be moved automatically.** Look out for a letter called a Universal Credit Migration Notice from DWP.

**DO claim Universal Credit by the deadline you are given** otherwise your benefits will stop and you could be worse off. If you live with a partner you will have to make a joint claim.

**DO NOT make a claim for Universal Credit before you receive your written notice**, otherwise you will not get protected entitlement and could be worse off.

# Uttlesford Citizens Advice can help with the move to Universal Credit and lots more!

Tax credits, managed by HMRC, are coming to an end, so most people will need to move onto Universal Credit instead. The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) have started sending out Universal Credit Migration Notices, explaining what you'll need to do, and by when.

Kate Robson, CEO of Uttlesford Citizens Advice, said: "We are worried that people will assume they will be moved across to Universal Credit automatically, but this is not the case. When you receive your letter from DWP it's important to act quickly and claim Universal Credit by the deadline you are given, otherwise your benefits will stop and you may end up worse off.

But, beware of being too organised! Don't be tempted to make a claim for Universal Credit before you receive your written notice. If you do this you will not receive protected entitlement and could be disadvantaged financially."

If you are worried about the change or need help to make a claim, you can get in touch with Uttlesford Citizens Advice by telephone, email, or by using the secure video links from the libraries in Great Dunmow, Stansted and Thaxted or at the Old School House in Takeley.

Trained advisers can also check your benefit entitlements, help with budgeting or money worries, offer energy efficiency advice to cut your energy bills, offer support with housing problems, employment discrimination issues and help you emergency support access from Uttlesford food bank or other local charities if needed.
