

Potholes and drains

I have recently completed the logging of the potholes and drains in Mill Road, Henham and Hall Road, Elsenham in an effort to get these particularly dangerous potholes repaired.

This has involved photographing, siting with What3Words, measuring length, width and depth to give continuity for the increase in the damage done; then logging these with Essex Highways.

I have emailed Cllr Ray Gooding of Essex County Council and Cllr Lee Scott of Essex Highways who has referred the details to Cllr Tom Cunningham who now has this remit.

I noted on the Essex Highways website that one of these potholes, by the entrance to Daisy May's, was registered with them as early as 1st November 2023 but is still awaiting inspection. Advice notes as quoted below:

Enquiry No: 2876083 1/11/23 An inspector will carry out an initial assessment to determine the next appropriate action, which may include a site visit. This could take up to 28 days. Please continue to check for updates.

There was no visible proof that an inspection had been carried out during November or December as there were no white or red painted lines around the holes or drains.

An update on 7^{th} January 2024 changes the enquiry number and gives the same advice. Enquiry No: 2886046 7/1/24

I shall be continuing to check for updates, writing to those whose job it is to ensure that they uphold the motto/aim for Essex Highways of SAFER/GREENER/HEALTHIER.

However, I would like to also say that progress was made on the earlier potholes in Mill Road so there is hope.

PS. Sue has now been informed that these will be inspected within five days, from the 12/1/24. We should start to see white and red paint around them. Maybe they will have been fixed by the time the February Dragon is delivered!

The Barn Theatre, Little Easton.

I would just like to share with your readers the very enjoyable experience Sheena & I had while being entertained at the **Barn Theatre**, **Little Easton** leading up to Christmas.

Although I have known about the theatre for many years an extraordinarily little advertising is given to their productions so on a whim, I visited their website and booked for two shows.

The first was a two-act comedy "Waiting for God" preceded by a 2/3 course meal of a very high standard.

Enthused by this, a week later we reserved our seats for a pre-Xmas show entitled "The Good Old Days" with mulled wine & mince pies. As you can imagine this was an action-packed performance based upon the TV series of the same name. A glittering array of artists performed song & dance, magic, comedy & recitation all chaired by the "Equivably, accredited, pre-eminently, splendidly & resplendent" Chairman.

Throughout the whole show the packed audience (all ages inc.children) sang along to a chorus of well known songs of the period.

The evening had even more relevance to us when learning of the history of the theatre. Performers who have trod the very boards included Charlie Chaplin, Gracie Fields, H.G.Wells, George Formby to name but a few.

The Barn Theatre reputed to have been the location of Tudor revels in the sixteenth century was converted from the village tithe barn to a theatre in 1913 by Daisy, Countess of Warwick 'to amuse her growing family'. The song "Daisy, Daisy, Give Me Your Answer Do "was written about her, and Grenville was Daisy's family name. The Grenville Theatre Company continue to perform plays twice a year in the Spring and Autumn.



Chilly conditions often greet us as we step outside in the early months of the year. The



old saying - "When the wind is out of the East, tis never good for man nor beast" - certainly rings true. Before the advent of broadcast weather forecasts, people had to rely on checking nearby weathervanes for the wind direction. These were usually found on tall buildings such as church spires, while Audley End House has gilded weathervanes illustrated here. A variety of designs can be seen, for

example the one in Braughing in the photo below.

Robert McFarlane's books of old words include about fifty that describe winds, storms or clouds. One Essex term he mentions is *aigrish*, used to describe a sharp cutting wind. The East Anglian word for a strong sudden gust is *gussock*, or *twitchy* for an unsteady wind



Forecasting the weather for those who till the soil is helpful as weeks of westerly winds can bring relentless rain causing waterlogging of the ground, while cold easterly winds dry out the soil and retard growth.

Currently, the UK Meteorological Office operates over 200 official automated sites, each recording accurate measurements of temperature, wind speed and direction, and the amount of precipitation. These readings are processed by powerful computers and the results enable forecasters to make predictions about future weather conditions. Local recording sites include the Cambridge Botanic Gardens and Stansted Airport. By searching the Met Office website https://www.metoffice.gov.uk you can check the local weather forecast to help plan your day.

Many individuals or schools are interested in operating a personal weather station and the Met Office is keen to enhance the weather observations network; it asks those who have a personal weather station, manual or automatic, to send data to its Weather Observations Website, WOW, at https://www.metoffice.gov.uk.

Declaration of interests: The Chair reminded Councillors of their duty to declare any relevant personal or pecuniary interests.

1. Apologies for Absence - District Cllr P Lees and County Cllr R. Gooding

2. Approval of the Minutes of the Last Meeting

The minutes of the 5 October 2023 meeting was approved and signed by the Chair. The meeting scheduled for 2 November 2023 was cancelled due to the local flooding caused by Storm Ciaran.

3. Matters Arising -

Cllr Francis has resigned due to moving out of the parish. The Parish Council thanks Cllr Francis for all his work as a councillor. The Parish Council welcomes Cllr Walker who is filling the position created some time ago (and before this year's elections) by a prior councillor's resignation.

4. Reports and Recommendations

- (i) Greens and Village Estate Cllr. Baker:
 - 1 Greens damage (1) Erosion General greens erosion in the village causing other potholes. A review of the damage will be conducted in the spring. (2) Construction damage by Hollybank Cllr Lee declared an interest and absented himself from any discussions. The shingle has now been colour matched, however, the greens remain damaged. Following a discussion, it was agreed the Chair would write to the owner of the property requesting repair to the greens now that the building works have been completed. (3) Building materials on Greens by York Cottage it is noted that building materials that were on village greens have been removed, however there is damage to greens on the driveway. The Parish Council will monitor whilst works are still ongoing. (4) Driving over Greens It was noted that there has been recent incidents of people driving over the greens and parking on the greens in the village, causing damage. Chair will write an article for the Dragon and will circulate a no parking letter to Cllrs to display on offending vehicles.
 - 2 Greens Bylaws Legal advice now received, Chair to review over the coming months as the procedure for changing the bylaws is complicated.
 - 3 Coronation commemoration A generous resident who is very skilled at ironmongery has kindly offered to design and make a sculpture to celebrate the coronation and will be making a start on this in the new year.
 - **4** Tree Inspection Report awaited Chair has chased for this. Pond tree work completed successfully 6/10/23.
 - 5 Church works The Church has asked the developer to provide the Parish Council with its insurance documents which have now been provided. An update on the works by the PCC has previously been circulated to all councillors. Cllr Lee is liaising with the PCC regarding screening.
 - **6 Resurfacing The Row** The Row path falls within the ownership of the Henham Parish Council as it is part of the greens. Cllr Leech will review the damage.

Village ponds/Woodland – (a) It was previously agreed that that the Chair and Cllr Fisher would consider options for possibly creating two new ponds. The Parish Council also previously discussed the management of PC owned Woodland in Mill Road. (b) Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy – Cllr Franklin attended a meeting on this and has circulated his meeting notes. There may be scope in considering how HPC could join this initiative to protect and increase local bio-diversity.

Specifically moving forward with the woodland space opposite Hilltop yard and potentially in other locations around the Parish. Following a discussion, it was agreed that Cllr Franklin would liaise with ELNR regarding the woodland, Cllr Walker would liaise with the National Trust and Cllr Rutterford would liaise with our ecologist regarding suggestions for other entities which may like to take responsibility for the woodland.

Village Hall – (1) General – update by Cllr Fisher regarding some further works to the village hall, which have been put on hold whilst the historic subsidence insurance claim is ongoing. Following a discussion, Cllr Fisher proposed, seconded by Cllr LeCount, that in principle the Parish Council would be prepared to pay £4k for the rendering at the rear of the property, approved by Cllrs, Cllr Lee abstained. Clerk has paid the second instalment of the HPC grant (£2500) to the village hall. Concerns raised regarding visitor parking at village hall damaging greens, Cllr Fisher will raise this with the village hall committee. (2) Solicitors - have been instructed to review the ownership and responsibility for the village hall as the existing documentation is 100 years old and needs updating. A final report from our solicitors is due before Christmas (3) HPC Community Support Fund – Nothing to report other than first payment of £186 has been made to Henham Village Hall in respect of grant awarded to Dinky Dragons hall hire costs. Positive feedback from Dinky Dragons has been circulated to all Cllrs.

PCSO – The PCSO will be available to discuss any resident concerns in the village shop between 10am-1am on December 11. Everyone welcome.

Speedwatch –Cllr Walker and the Henham parish speedwatch coordinator met with other Essex parish Speedwatch coordinators on Monday 6th November 2023 at Stansted Mountfitchet Fire Station, it was a useful and well attended event. Cllr Walker noted more volunteers are required to comply with insurance regulations. Cllr Walker also explained data collected over the past 17 months and there was a discussion about potentially moving the Wood End Green sign to a more effective location.

Management of Pledgdon Green – (a) Ownership of Common Land - A resident has previously contacted Cllr Rutterford about a fallen bough/tree on the common land which has fallen on their property. Legal advice re ownership/responsibilities of the common land has established that the Parish Council is not responsible for the common land. Cllr Rutterford and Cllr Baker had a meeting to review the legal advice and will liaise with our solicitors seeking further clarification on a couple of points. (b) Conservation Area Status - Broxted Parish Council is exploring whether the Brick End Road area could become a Conservation Area and have asked whether Henham Parish Council would be interested in splitting the costs (initially £1,000- £1,500 plus VAT) into extending the proposed conservation area to include to the Pledgdon Green area. Following a discussion, it was agreed that Cllr Rutterford would consult with local residents in her capacity as a private individual before any decision is made by the Henham Parish Council.

Website – The new website is up and running https://henham-pc.gov.uk. The clerk has now set up each Cllr with a new gov.org email address. It was previously agreed that Cllrs would try out the new email system before deciding on a policy for email use. On the whole the majority of Cllrs are finding the new system easy to use, some external IT support will be provided to those Cllrs requiring assistance with setting it up.

Village Broadband - Openreach and Gigaclear both have plans to bring Ultrafast Broadband to Village. Both intend to hold open days in the village in near future. The Parish Council has a responsibility to ensure residents are fully informed of both endeavours and have the information to make an informed decision that suits them: (1) Openreach - The Parish Council has been approached by Openreach regarding increasing broadband speeds - The UK Government has launched a campaign through DSIT to support rural communities who don't currently have access to Ultrafast Full Fibre Broadband, and where there are no current plans to build. They have made vouchers available to eligible residential and commercial premises which can be used towards the cost of providing the fibre infrastructure. The vouchers need to be pledged to a registered network build supplier. Openreach is one of the Government's registered network build suppliers and have helped hundreds of local communities across the UK get high-speed broadband. So, in partnership with Government funding, Openreach could bring Ultrafast Full Fibre Broadband to communities using these vouchers. The vouchers are free, but recipients are expected to order an Ultrafast Full Fibre Broadband service from a supplier of their choice once service is live, as part of the terms and conditions. Openreach held a well attended open day on 5th December 2023 in the village hall 12-3pm for residents. (2) Gigaclear - Cllr Franklin continues to chase Gigaclear to repair the damaged box on OML which residents have repaired at the own expense and are seeking recompense from Gigaclear (Complaint Case Number: 01370719). Gigaclear are currently in the village installing their infrastructure. The Chair has written to Gigaclear seeking assurance that damage to the greens will be repaired.

Airport Parking – Cllrs LeCount and Franklin attended a UDC meeting on 2/11/23 to discuss the problem of airport parking in our area. Cllr Rutterford previously informed Cllr Franklin that there are airport parking issues on Bedwell Road (in Elsenham parish) which is preventing a local farmer (based in Henham parish) from accessing his fields to harvest. This has been reported to UDC Enforcement team to investigate. However, if the vehicle is taxed and insured and not causing a "day to day" obstruction or parked where there is a parking restriction this is not an offence. UDC Planning enforcement will pursue unapproved car park sites. Stansted Airport have a £200k fund to help with this issue but UDC have to enable a procedure for obtaining and using it. Some communication links for residents and Parish Councils may be forthcoming, however, there was little of immediate assistance on offer to the Parishes' adjoining the airport who suffer greatly from the off-airport parking scourge.

D Day June 2024 celebrations – A resident and his team have kindly volunteered to organise an event to be held on Saturday 22nd June 2024, 1940's theme with a band, BBQ, army tanks. This event will not be run by the Parish Council nor will it have any responsibility other than to advise on Health and Safety aspects, which Cllr Franklin has kindly agreed to deal with. Following a discussion Cllrs agreed a contribution towards the event: £850 plus VAT for the band, £800 plus VAT for the toilet hire and £200 for the bins.

Christmas Tree – The Parish Council thanks the volunteers for their assistance with installing the village tree on 3 December. The Chair will organise dismantling the tree in the new year.

Stansted/Elsenham Surgery merger – All patients have received a direct communication from the surgery about the proposed merger. Update from Cllr LeCount who will circulate edited minutes from the latest patient liaison group meeting.

Investigation into alleged breach- alleged airport parking at Railway car park, Old Mead Road District Cllr Lees to make further enquiries as to planning permission for parking. Nothing to report.

Invesigation into alleged breach-without planning permission. The importation of waste material at land adjacent to Pennington Hall , Henham road , Elsenham CM22 6DH- UDC's Planning Enforcement Team has investigated a referral regarding the alleged breach of planning control at the above mentioned address, reference ENF/22/0043/C. The Council issued an enforcement notice which required the following actions to be carried out: a) Cease, and do not resume, the importation, depositing, sorting and spreading of waste material on the Land; b) Remove all the waste material and the earth bund located in the area hatched blue on the attached plan without redistribution within the existing site; c)Restore the land in the area hatched blue on the attached plan to its condition prior to the commencement of the unauthorised development. UDC confirm that compliance checks have been carried out to the property and the notice has largely been complied with. UDC has now closed the file. The notice will remain on the land hereafter.

A resident is looking into enforcing the weight limit along OMR. Cllr LeCount to attend a meeting with local residents in January 2024. Mill Road/School Road yellow lines — Nothing to report.

- 7. SAW (Stop Stansted Expansion) Cllr Franklin has volunteered to attend SAW meetings on behalf of the Parish Council, taking this role over from Cllr Rutterford. Cllrs agreed Cllr Franklin has authority to vote on behalf of the Parish Council. Cllr Franklin attended a meeting for SAW members on 29/11/23. There was a Q&A on the proposal to convert the organisation to a Trust and put it into "hibernation" with funds of about £90K. As there are no takers to replace the existing team there were no other realistic options tabled. The motion was carried nem com. In the future, over the next 5 years, local parish councils are expected to provide replacement trustees for the initial 5 who will be the current executive committee. The Trust objectives will mirror those of SAW and the funds would be available to fight any future undesirable expansion at the airport. Subject to trustee scrutiny. A members letter has now been circulated confirming the situation.
- **8. Governance** The Parish Council Standing Orders and Financial Regulations have been circulated by the Clerk to all Councillors for review in the coming months.

9. Local Plan —Documents related to the local plan can be found at: www.uttlesford.gov.uk/new-local-plan. Discuss draft Local Plan which has now been published on the UDC website. Chair's letter regarding the incorrect allocation of 200 Bloor homes to Elsenham Parish has been sent to UDC and was acknowledged by UDC but unfortunately no amendments made to the published draft local plan. Elsenham Parish Council is supporting the fact that the 200 houses have been wrongly allocated to their parish. Sub-planning Committee has recommended to councillors that legal advice is sought now in readiness should UDC not reallocate the 200 homes in the Henham Parish, potential legal fees would be £1000-1500 plus VAT plus costs for a junior barrister for expert legal advice, this recommendation was agreed by Cllrs. There was also a discussion regarding SAW concerns raised in connection with areas within Countryside Protection Zone being included within the Local Plan, but it is the view of the Parish Council that our duty is towards our own residents and the protection of our village against spurious developments which is a huge risk should the Local Plan not be finalised.

District Councillor's Report January 2024

Mid December, we were disappointed to receive a letter form Michael Gove regarding the Local Plan. It told us nothing new –Uttlesford has not updated its Local Plan since 2005. The last submitted plan as you know, was unsound and not good enough to be tinkered with according to the Inspectors. We are some way into rectifying this, having voted at full Council on 30th October to submit the draft Local Plan to a full public consultation. Mr Gove and his team also know this, so the demand that we send him a timetable for submitting a Local Plan within 12 weeks is perplexing as that timetable (known technically as our Local Development Plan) was published months ago, and we were able to send him the link within moments of receiving his letter demanding it!

We look forward to collaborating with all councillors through 2024 to refine and improve our Reg 18 draft plan into a stronger, better, and evidence-based Reg 19 final plan for us to vote on this coming summer. There will be opportunities over the coming

months to see and consider all the consultation responses, as well as to explore in detail (and amend as necessary) policy chapters on vitally important issues like affordable housing, infrastructure, and biodiversity, as well of course of substantially reducing the housing site allocations once we know how many additional homes have been approved between April 2023 and April 2024, and can therefore come off our allocations target.

All consultation responses will be published, and any questions will be answered and published.

We would like to thank you for your patience and understanding regarding our refuse collections. "Crews have been dealing with a much higher than anticipated volume being left out for collection over the festive season. They have braced inclement weather and now Crews have to travel to Braintree to empty their full trucks after Essex County Council moved the site from Dunmow, meaning it takes crews longer to get back on the road. Our crews continue to smile and have dog biscuits in their pockets.

Having an airport in the district, means that we have people fleeing real crisis in their home countries, land here in our District. It was an honour and a privilege for Petrina to attend a reception to thank the exceptional volunteers, community partners and community and public sectors who helped at the airport following the Ukrainian and Sudanese Crises. Eduard Fesko the Ukrainian Ambassador attended and gave a moving speech, about the realities of war. The compassion for our neighbours and the selfless work, time, and kindness that members of our district have demonstrated is something to be proud of.

We still have monies available from our Ward Initiative Fund.

Church News





Another year, another BBC Sports Personality of the Year. 2023 saw the 70th edition and completed a hat-trick of women as Mary Earls followed previous winners Beth Mead and Emma Raducanu (two footballers and a tennis player).

As a nation we love sport (especially watching it) so at our recent Christmas Morning Service, we considered an unlikely theological question: If God were a sportsman, what sport would he play?!

Cricketer Stuart Broad took second place in the award this year, and a cricketer last won in 2019 (Ben Stokes). Perhaps if God played sport, he'd be a cricketer.

But think about what happens in cricket: the batsman tries to hit the ball; the bowler tries to get you out; and the fielders try to catch you out. Some people think that's what God is like: trying to catch us out, trying to do us down. But it's not true. God made this world, and he loves what he has made. He's not trying to get us out. So, it seems God is not a cricketer! What about tennis? The players serve. They return. The Bible says that Jesus came to serve and that one day he will return. Maybe God would be a tennis player. Or maybe he'd play football. One person shoots, somebody else saves. Jesus came to save. His name means God saves. Maybe God would be a footballer.

But actually, there's something else. Just once in 70 years has this sport produced a winner of Sports Personality of the Year. The clue in is John's Gospel chapter 1, verse 12. Speaking about Jesus, John says: to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.

I wonder if you can think of a sport where someone wants to pass you something, and you can pick it up? In fact, you must receive it almost like a present, a gift.

The sport is rugby (and its only winner was Jonny Wilkinson 20 years ago). You see, God has something that he wants to pass to us: the right to be his child. The Bible says that we are not his children by right of birth: his creatures yes, but not his children. To be his child is something he must pass to us, and it is something he yearns to pass to us.

And it is something we must receive as a gift or a present. And receiving God's pass means to believe in Jesus. In the Bible, to believe is to trust something enough to let it change your life. The gift God wants us to receive is Jesus. And when we do that, when we believe in his name, there is this incredible promise that we will become children of God: Children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God -a permanent, miraculous, wonderful change of status.

I have absolutely no authority for this at all....but if God were a sportsman, perhaps he'd play rugby.

In Memoriam Roshan Banatvala



Roshan Banatvala, a longstanding resident of Henham and influential schoolteacher died on 9 December 2023 aged 89.

Roshan moved to Henham, with her husband Jangu and two small children, Nicholas and Jonathan in 1965. Christopher and Emma were born a little later. Unlike many of their friends who moved away, Roshan and Jangu, who were married for 64 years, remained in the village - their home becoming in many ways a second home to their nine grandchildren.

Roshan was born in Bombay in 1934. Her childhood home was a stone's throw from the Gateway of India. From her apartment she watched Independence play out in 1947 with Ghandi, Mountbatten and Nehru all passing under her balcony. After joining her aunt teaching some of

Mumbai's poorest communities she decided, aged 10, to be a teacher.

At 15, Roshan came to England with her family. She said right from the start that she took to it like "a duck to water" and never looked back. After completing her schooling, she enrolled at Whitelands College, now Roehampton University, to train as a primary schoolteacher. During her 40-year career, she taught at many local schools and was middle-head at Waterside in Bishop's Stortford.

A highly regarded teacher, she was at the forefront of education; knowing that individual children have individual needs. A former pupil said that Roshan was "the first teacher [she] ever respected" and "remembered the security [she] felt in having her as a teacher and knowing that she would understand whatever she taught". Often described as "strict but fair" by her pupils. She would bring this discipline to home life, where she would get her own children to recite times tables up to the bath and rightly admonish them for substandard work! Roshan kept up with many of her pupils and for one this meant fulfilling a promise made to an 8-year-old child to take her to the opera... some 15 years later.

Roshan had a strong but quiet faith: baptised and confirmed whilst living in Henham. Her faith was hugely important in coming to terms when Emma died in 1998. As many in the village will testify, Emma was one of Henham's real characters – and on many occasions stretched Roshan's parental skills to the limit!

Her greatest quality was inclusiveness and equality. Welcoming friends into the family. Roshan loved Henham, its social life and entertaining such as the Boxing Day hunt. Her cooking was legendary - 8 puddings for 10 guests. She had a wide range of interests, from oil painting to silversmithing (with her own hallmark). She enjoyed literature, theatre, and music (especially opera and orchestral music, but also anything ABBA).

Her funeral was held at St Mary's in Elsenham, because Henham church is undergoing renovation. Roshan's family, in true schoolmistress fashion, were left clear instructions on how the service should be conducted, with a message that the congregation should "sing up".

The grandchildren all recounted Roshan's love, support, and generosity. Often bringing them together, the relationships she fostered were "the gift to us all". She even tried to delay a West End show, because not all her grandchildren had arrived!

The service was one of celebration, with family and friends from Henham and beyond, saying goodbye to her in a packed church.

In The Garden

Hello again Dear Reader and a Happy New Year to you. I hope you were able to enjoy the festivities, despite all the doom and gloom we seem to be bombarded with these days. The weather these days seems to be a lot less predictable and a lot more extreme. Already this year we have seen very mild weather, alternating with extremely cold periods and also severe flooding. Even though we don't suffer as much as some from the flooding, the ground is completely waterlogged and therefore should be worked on as little as possible.

In the flower beds, this is your last chance to cut back any of the perennials you may have missed. If you have already done this, now is the time to apply a top dressing to boost the nutrients in the soil. I use "Blood, Fish & Bone", but you can use bone meal or anything similar. Just sprinkle it by hand, applying it as evenly as you can. There is no need to fork or hoe it in, as the rain will wash it into the soil. With the ground as soft as it is at the moment, weeding is a much easier task and extremely important.

If you have a greenhouse and heated propagators, you can start your seed sowing program now. I always try to get an early start with my tomatoes to hopefully get an earlier crop. There are also many hardy annuals that can be started now. Busy Lizzies are a good example. Many people find them difficult to grow from seed, but after many different attempts, I seem to have found a method which works (fingers crossed)! Fill a seed tray with a good seed or multi-purpose compost. Sow the seeds finely all over the surface (broadcast), then cover with a light covering of vermiculite. Place the tray either in a heated propagator, or on a heat mat. If you are using a propagator, check regularly for germination and prick out as soon as the plants are big enough to handle. If you leave them for too long they will go spindly.

Summer flowering Clematis can be pruned now. Cut them back quite hard, to about 30 cm (12 inches) from the ground, making the cut just above a pair of buds. Similarly, Winter Jasmine can be cut back as soon as it finishes flowering. Cut back shoots which have flowered by about half. Try to avoid days when a hard frost is predicted.

If you tend to use a hoe for weeding, be very careful at this time of year, as with the mild weather we have experienced over the past couple of winters, the spring bulbs are coming through somewhat earlier than one would expect and the last thing you want is to chop the tops of the plants as they come through.

If you haven't yet done so, you should be thinking about getting your lawnmower serviced. If you leave it until spring, you will probably have a seven or eight week wait, whereas now you will probably only have to wait two or three weeks.

I'm going to repeat one of my useful tips, as this is the time of year when you may well be thinking of sowing broad beans. As you well know. Dear Reader, Blackfly is probably the biggest scourge of the broad bean plant. Like Vampires, they suck the life blood out of the plants voraciously. An easy way to prevent this is to is to plant a few cloves of garlic in between the rows of beans. You won't smell the garlic unless the leaves are crushed, but the sensitive sense of smell of the blackfly will deter them and hopefully send them off to pastures new.

Make sure you keep bird feeders topped up, particularly in really cold spells. Birds expend most of their energy looking for food, so if they know there is a regular source close by, it helps them tremendously. It is also very important to make sure they have clean drinking water to hand, so make sure you keep bird baths clean.

Each year, I keep an area of what I call "Wild Garden". This is simply an area where you don't cut the grass and you let things develop naturally. I say "I", but this was actually my wife's idea and I must confess I was not too keen on it originally. Over the past few years, however, I have grown (excuse the pun) to appreciate it and even develop the idea. I think it is important that you demonstrate that a wild area is intentional and not just an excuse not to cut the grass in that part of the garden and so I cut clear paths around and through the area. I have also tried to enhance the area by planting loads of Daffodil, Snakehead Fritillaria and Anemone bulbs randomly. To achieve a random effect, I find the best way is to throw a handful of bulbs on the ground and plant them where they land. Unfortunately, by late July or early August, the area is starting to look very untidy and that is when I cut it down and bring it back to grass.

I guess that's about it for this month, I don't want to over-excite you. Let's hope we get some decent weather so that we can get on with the preparations for spring. It's good to be back and I look forward to next month's article.

NEWS FROM THE GARDENS OF EASTON LODGE

News for February 2024

I am writing this as volunteers work to clear the Gardens of fallen trees and boughs brought down by the torrential rains and winds at the beginning of January. Hopefully February will be seasonal with some cold weather, of course, but also with some of those lovely bright winter days on which it is a joy to be outside, seeing the early flowers emerge.

Of course, for us that means snowdrops, and with luck some aconites too. The snowdrops have spread hugely through the Gardens in recent years – partly because we have planted extra, but also because we have been careful to leave grass cutting till after the bulbs have replenished themselves and divided, producing extra bulbs; and after they have formed seeds, which apparently are planted unwittingly by ants carrying them into their nests!



We don't have as many aconites as we would like. Their bright yellow flowers make for such a cheerv sight, often coming a bit before the snowdrops. They native to Italy, Bulgaria, the Balkans, Turkey, and Iraq. I have read they were introduced to Britain in 1596 and were first recorded as being

naturalised in the wild in 1838. We have some longstanding clumps – I wonder when they were planted? But we have found it difficult to establish more. We keep trying though!!

Our open days for snowdrops are on Sunday 18, Thursday 22, Sunday 25 and Thursday 29 February and we have our fingers crossed that the snowdrops will be at their best then. Gates open at 11.00 and tickets will be purchasable in advance through our website or direct through www.Trybooking.com. Snowdrops in the green will be on sale. Please note that the gardens of Warwick House are not open to visitors on the Thursdays. For more information go to our website www.eastonlodge.co.uk
