

Night Flights

I was on Uttlesford Council in 2003 when the Planning Agreement was made with the then owners of Stansted Airport to restrict night flights to 13,700 per annum. By and large, this agreement has produced reasonable relationships with the Airport who have always claimed to want to be a good partner with the local community. The latest proposals by the Manchester Group for unrestricted night flights would totally shatter this consensus and would cause unacceptable levels of noise pollution for residents.

I therefore urge everyone to register their concerns and support the present arrangements being sustained at night.flights@dft.gov.uk.

Night Flights Stansted Airport

Recently Stansted Airport Watch (SAW) released a press release titled "YOUR COMMUNITY NEEDS YOU"

The opening statement says it all!

"The most important public consultation for a generation about the future impact of Stansted Airport is currently underway. At stake is the prospect of the Government removing all of its current statutory restrictions on night flights at Stansted, which have been in force for over 40 years"

The press release is very detailed and can be found online at www.stanstedairportwatch.com

It gives many reasons why there should not be an increase in night flights and also goes further to argue that night flights should be phased out altogether but by way of summary includes:

- 1) Phase out night flights altogether as they are particularly intrusive in rural areas with low background night noise levels.
- 2) At the very least, No increase should be allowed and "night" should mean night from 23.00- 07.00 with the only exception being emergency landings.
- 3) No exceptions or dispensations. This is open to abuse and misinterpretation by airport management.

- 4) Ban reverse thrust at Stansted Airport other than in exceptional circumstances. This practice is highly intrusive and unnecessary on Stansted long runway.
- 5) Health impacts. Aircraft noise particularly at night or early hours of the morning can have a very negative impact on both the physical and mental well-being of individual and local communities as a whole. The negative impact is far greater than any economic benefits.
- 6) Nights flights are already the biggest single cause of noise complaints by local residents and to increase or worse still remove all limits would be complete disregard for the welfare of all local communities.
- 7) MAG are putting profit before people whilst at the same time shamefully going against its planning agreement with UDC.

In addition to the reasons above or more simply, this is a government consultation not a planning application. As such it is vital that you respond citing your own experience of the disruption that night flights can cause or might cause, and how it affects your lives personally.

We believe the impact on Henham, surrounding villages and local residents would be devastating to say the least. As such we encourage as many residents as possible to respond to the consultation, making it very clear that we do not want more Stansted night flights and try to convince the Government not to bow to pressure from the airport. 

Developments: Mill Road Development : Cllr Walker is taking the lead on this and is liaising with the developer's agents and residents. The Developer has confirmed that the project website has uploaded been (https://newhomesforhenham.co.uk/). This provides basic information about the proposals and has facilities for residents to register for updates and ask questions. The Chair and Cllr Walker met with the Developers Bellway Homes and their agents on 14 March 2024. UTT/24/0670/DFO - proposed Details following outline application UTT/20/0604/OP for the development of 45 no. dwellings and associated landscaping and new open space - details of layout, scale, appearance and landscaping (including details to discharge condition 8), land south of Vernons Close Mill Road – sub-planning committee will review and respond before deadline on 1/5/24.

Bloor – **UTT/23/2063/DFO** – proposed Details following outline approval of reserved matters (comprising landscaping, layout, scale and appearance) pursuant to outline approval S62A/2022/0012 (UTT/22/2760/PINS) for the development of 200 residential dwellings along with landscaping, internal roads, public open space and associated infrastructure works, Land East Of Station Road. Sub planning committee has submitted its concern with UDC planning regarding proposed run off to OMR. Sub planning committee have now submitted concerns with UDC regarding proposed run off to OMR 3/4/24

Bedwell Road - UTT/24/0543/OP – Proposed Outline planning permission with all matters reserved except access for the erection of up to 240 dwellings with public open space, landscaping and sustainable drainage system (SuDS) and vehicular access point, Land North of Bedwell Road And East Of Old Mead Road Ugley And Henham. Chair has written to UDC requesting an extension for submitting objection due to tight time frame with Easter, UDC have agreed to extend deadline to 15/5/24. Elsenham Parish Council has instructed a noise expert, sub-planning committee have recommended the Parish Council contributes half

towards the estimated £1500 initial cost, previously agreed by Cllrs via email. The Chair informed Cllrs that the s106 applications for this project include an contribution to Elsenham Community Hall, a contribution to an extension to Elsenham Surgery and clearance work in Henham Parish following the closure of a railway crossing.

<u>OMR-OML</u> –Nothing to report other than OMR closed 3/4/24 for 3 days for EH to carry out drainage investigations and repairs.

HGV waste lorries - Cllr LeCount to review.

<u>School parking</u> - County Cllr Gooding has commenced steps to organise School Lane as a 'School Street' on arrival and departure times, this is ongoing, Travel Plan to be put in place as part of this process.

<u>Toot Toot signage</u> – County Cllr Gooding confirmed that this will be on the Highways Panel scheme for next year.

<u>Potholes – County Cllr Gooding</u> is reporting issues with Little Henham to EH, Cllrs raised concerns that there are also urgent issues with Thaxted Road and Pledgdon Green.

<u>Brick End Lane</u> – Cllr Rutterford has raised concerns with EH and Environmental Health regarding fly tipping causing blockage and heavy damage caused by diversion route.

Residents are encouraged to also report any matters to Essex Highways direct via the Essex Highways web site www.essexhighways.org (details also on the Henham Website), as the more people who complain regarding Highways matters the more likely something will get done.

Whether birds evolved flight to descend from the trees or to rise up from the ground will be the first question to be tackled at the Saturday Seminar on 11th May. Mike Howgate MSc FLS will discuss two controversies on the Evolution of Flight - How Birds Fly and The Dinosaur Bird Link. Sometimes known as "Dr Dinosaur", Mike is the General Secretary and Chairman of the Amateur Geological Society of North London and is a member of the Linean Society of London. In the first part of the seminar he will look at the evolution of flight and will then move on to discussing the prevalent theory amongst paleontologists that birds arose from a group of Therapod dinosaurs.

At the General Meeting on 16th May we look forward to enjoying a performance from singer, songwriter and musician, Saffron Summerfield. Saffron's career has taken her from live performance on TV and on John Peel's radio show to tours abroad and playing blues guitar alongside black musicians in the Mississippi cotton fields. Her performance entitled "Milton Keynes to Mississippi" will feature different styles of guitar from the classical to the blues.

In March, Ed Fairey, Essex County Organiser for the National Garden Scheme entertained the Garden Group with the history of the NGS. He described how it came into being: why it has always supported nursing charities, and how in 1928, its foundation year, it raised over £8,000 for the Queen's Nursing Institute. Since 1980, when it became independent of the QNI, it has benefited a wider range of health charities, including Macmillan Cancer Support, Marie Curie, Hospice UK, The Careers' Trust and Parkinson's UK. In May the Garden Group will continue its own support of the NGS with a visit to "The Mount" in Roydon which opens to visitors under the scheme.

In the Garden

Well Dear Reader, I hope you will be happy to hear that I'm still here, dodging the rain and the puddles. It really has been a terribly wet spring, but also quite a warm one, which appears to have confused Mother Nature as much as me. As climate change continues, it becomes more and more difficult to predict when plants will be in flower. I did consider turning my garden into a paddy field and growing rice, but fortunately I regained enough of my sanity to discard the idea.

Anyway, let's get back to the serious business of gardening. Daffodils and tulips, like me, will now be past their best, but don't be tempted to cut the foliage down yet. They need to be left for about six weeks for the goodness to feed back into the bulbs. Cutting them back too early will mean smaller and fewer flowers next year. If you really need the space, you could lift them carefully, taking care not to damage the bulbs, and either heel them in in a "V"-shaped trench in a corner of the garden or, if space is at a premium, they can be dried out on a bench in the greenhouse or a warm place indoors. Resist the temptation to cut off any green growth and wait until it has all have turned brown. You can then strip them off and store the bulbs. Don't throw them into a box or bag en masse as they may rot; instead, store them in single layers, ready for re-planting later in the year.

As the flowers of rhododendrons and azaleas fade, they should be removed. This is done by carefully pinching out the flower head just above the two small buds forming on the stem. Long fingernails are invaluable for this fiddly task, but if you have carefully manicured hands, snips will do the job. Be very careful not to break off the two buds just below the flower head, as they produce next year's flowers.

I start putting my plant supports in about now, before they are really needed, as the plants can then grow into position. This is particularly important for taller plants such as delphiniums, hollyhocks achillea etc. It also, and perhaps more importantly, means you are less likely to trample on other plants in the process. Another quite clever idea, if you have any old, unwanted wire hanging baskets, is to place them, upside down, over lower growing plants. The plants will then grow up through the wire frame and will be supported without any unsightly canes.

Now here is another of my "Not a lot of people know that" tips. Most of us have a rose or two in our gardens, but not everyone knows that roses are probably the hungriest plants in the garden and when they are coming into flower they are looking for one particular type of food, potassium. Proprietary rose feeds have this, as does sulphate of potash, but for that extra boost of potassium, look no

further than your fruit bowl and the humble banana. The middle bit might be good for us, but the best bit for your roses is the skin, it contains more potassium than any other fruit skin. Chop the skins into small pieces and fork them into the soil at the base of the bush, taking care not to damage the roots. As the skins rot down they will release their potassium into the soil in a form that the plant can use immediately. The result is better flowering, with larger, longer lasting blooms, stronger scents, richer colours and bigger, brighter hips. What more could you want?

This is the month for preparing your pots and hanging baskets. There is now an amazing variety of both pots and baskets available in the shops and garden centres. Here are a few simple tips to use when planting pots. Firstly, if you are planting up new pots, instead of putting broken crocks in the bottom for drainage, use broken up polystyrene. This serves a two-fold purpose. Firstly, the pots are lighter and easier to handle and it is a good way of disposing of old seed trays and packaging which is not recyclable. Secondly, you don't have to use as much new compost to fill the pots. I keep a supply of spent compost, mix in some organic, slow-release fertilizer (I use blood, fish and bone) and use it to part fill the pots about half to two thirds full. I then top up the pot with fresh compost. You should, however, always fill hanging baskets with fresh compost. If you use hanging baskets which are lined with polythene, remember to cut a few slits to allow drainage. Nowadays not many people use sphagnum moss as a liner, but if you do, put a small circle of polythene in the bottom of the basket to conserve water.

A large percentage of gardeners grow tomatoes. These days you can find them growing in the greenhouse, in the borders, in tubs and even in hanging baskets. No matter where they are, it makes no difference to those nasty little whiteflies. They will find them wherever are. A simple and cheap way to deter them is to plant French marigolds in amongst them. For some reason, known only to themselves, they can't stand the smell and will hopefully keep away. Although this seems to work with all varieties, I am told that "Boy-Oh-Boy" is the most effective.

Well Dear Reader, I don't know where the time goes, but I appear to have reached the end of this month's episode. It only remains for me to once again wish you the usual "Happy Gardening".

Henham Tennis Club News

Reverend Louis Wilson writes...

For the last 11 years, we have attended an event in Eastbourne called Bible by the Beach. A few years ago, Helen Roseveare the medical missionary was a speaker and told us this story about a trip to America.

She arrived at Chicago Airport and found that she had left all her travel documents at her friend's house: wallet, passport and ticket. These were the days before any mobiles or internet.

She joined the check-in queue anyway, got to the front and said: My name is Helen Roseveare, I don't have a ticket or passport or wallet - is there anything you can do? No, came the answer, there is nothing we can do.

She went to the back of the queue and she prayed. She moved back to the front and tried again. This time the attendant said: There is one possibility: If you can get someone to act as your guarantor to prove you are who you say you are, and to pay for your ticket, we'll let you on the flight....

Helen Roseveare did not know where to turn so asked: *Do you have a Chicago City phonebook? Would you be willing to look someone up for me?*

Sure, said the attendant – who shall I look up?

Dr Roseveare said, *I want you to start at the letter A – and I want you to stop when you reach the first name that has Reverend after it.*

So the attendant started looking and said: I've found one, there is a Rev. Atkins.

Please would you be willing to call him for me?

The attendant calls. A man picks up the phone. Yes, it's Rev. Atkins here. You have Helen Roseveare at the airport? I'd be delighted to act as her guarantor and I will come right away.

The man arrived at the airport, paid the money, she got the ticket and was able to go on her away. But before she left, he said to her: Mrs. Roseveare, you might be wondering why I've done this. Please would you allow me to explain?

Years ago, I was travelling round Asia with my girlfriend. We weren't Christians and to be honest we got up to some pretty bad stuff: drugs, alcohol, everything. We found ourselves in Kabul in Afghanistan. We were both desperately ill. We

didn't know what to do. We knocked on the door of the British consulate. They let us come in and use a tiny room.

My girlfriend went straight to sleep, but I couldn't. Eventually, I opened the bedside cabinet and found nothing except a book called *Give me this mountain*.

[Give me this mountain is the autobiography of Dr. Helen Roseveare]

That night, I read your book and I became a Christian. My girlfriend and I both recovered, and we got back to America. My girlfriend also became a Christian, and is now my wife. For the last 15 years I've been pastor of a church here in Chicago. Mrs. Roseveare, after all these years, it is a pleasure to meet you!

Remembering Margaret (Maggie) Smith 27May 1934 – 4 March 2024

From Malcolm's tribute given at the funeral service

Mum was not evacuated during the war. Growing up in South East London throughout the Blitz she developed a stoical, unsentimental character. Methodical and analytical, she spent much of her working life in laboratories beginning at Guy's Hospital and ending at the Royal Marsden where she worked on some of the earliest pioneering work in cancer research alongside Sir Roy Caine – a legend in groundbreaking surgery in the earliest days of the NHS.

While working at the Royal Marsden, she also attended night school where she met and married Dad. Having had the three of us, she returned to work for a short while, as a Lab Technician at Reigate Priority School, until some 50 years ago, when Karen, Geraldine and I were quite young, we moved as a family from Redhill to Henham.

To say Mum threw herself into village life would be an understatement. She was a regular churchgoer, choir member, took her turn in the flower rota and, in the late eighties, with the restoration of the bells at St Mary's Church, she signed up to learn the art of bellringing. There was, of course also tennis, which was akin to Mum's second faith - Wimbledon was treated like a religious observance every summer and she played tennis regularly for over 30 years. Being tall she had a formidable service and a devastating cross court volley. As well as being a stalwart of Redhill, Henham and Stansted tennis clubs Mum also represented the Essex WI and actually played with Joy Lafferty in a national doubles final at London's legendary Queens Club.

Along with tennis, church, science and bellringing Mum shared with Dad a passion for growing things - not so much flowers but fruit and vegetables. Our chest freezer groaned annually with the surplus of raspberries, strawberries, gooseberries, rhubarb, plums, runner beans oh so many runner beans! I often wondered if this zeal for self-sufficiency came from those early years during the Blitz. She almost certainly saw destruction and chaos no young child should really have ever seen.

But in the end, I hope she will forgive this one indulgence, as I say "Game Set and Match, Margaret Smith, Good Game!

As day length increases and the air becomes warmer, plants put out new shoots. Many insects emerge and birds pair up, preparing to breed. Since the 1960's the average minimum winter temperatures have been rising.

Snow fall is now a rarity, and frosty days are much less frequent. The current growing season is almost a month longer than 50 years ago. Primroses and bluebells opening earlier. are Researchers recorded that the first flowering of some 406 plant species has advanced by almost a month since 1986! This has a knock-on effect for the time of emergence of pollinating insects such as bees and butterflies; some are adapting to the warmer climate.

Hedgerow shrubs and trees are leafing and flowering earlier too, providing food for so many hungry caterpillars which are ideal food for nestlings. Hedgerows are a valuable wildlife habitat, often providing a living framework to the landscape and our rural heritage. Long-established hedges grow in soil that is rich in stored carbon and older trees within the hedgerow also hold large stores of carbon.

A recent planning application to fell an ancient hedgerow oak close to Clavering led to a vigorous and successful campaign by residents to save it. This tree is now registered on the Ancient Tree Inventory, a record similar to the one for listed buildings. There are more trees in local hedgerows that could be recorded - details of how to do this can be found on:


